



# Pembrokeshire Learning Campus

This new learning campus incorporates a new comprehensive school, a new vocational facility and sport and leisure resource that will be created on the site of the existing Pembroke Comprehensive School. Students with learning difficulties are to be fully accommodated in an integrated SEN and Autism facility tailored to meet the south of the county's needs and expectations.

The proposed new school will accommodate 1200 pupils plus 200 sixth form students. New and expanded vocational courses are to be offered for the post 16 years olds to widen their choice ranging from A levels to FE qualifications.

The 122 acre site offers the opportunity to develop an inspiring learning campus with fully integrated programme for both academic and vocational education in addition to the potential of land release for new housing.

The site enjoys valuable natural resources which can provide stimulating alternative learning environments for all age groups, including special groups with emotional and behavioural difficulties. Valuable resources of woodland, farmland, nursery facility and nature trail could be utilized for outdoor activities for both academic and vocational experiences.

The proposed campus will require a bus terminal to accommodate the need of approximately 30 buses to serve the school, the vocational provision and the sport and leisure facility. Sufficient car park spaces with an amended road layout and improved site access are to be incorporated in the design process.
